Expressive Arts and Design

Show time!

In your den and act out the story of the 3 little pigs,

Who will be the big bad wolf?

What are the pigs going to tell the wolf?

Make a mask for your character.

Mathematics

What's the time Mr. Wolf?" is a chasing game for a group of children that involves a bit of counting and talk of time of day.

1)

One child is Mr wolf The other children stand at the opposite end and shouts what's the time Mr wolf

Mr. Wolf answers with different times - "one o'clock" or "eight o'clock" the other children move that many steps and so on

When Mr. Wolf feels like it, he (or she) answers "dinnertime" and starts chasing the other children.

The first to be caught becomes the next Mr. Wolf.

Communication and Language.

While drawing your house ask your child questions about their houses.

How many rooms/windows does your house have?

Which is your favourite room and why?

Ask your child what we can do to look after our house? Eg tidy our toys.

Physical Development

Build a den.

Will your den be strong enough so the wolf cannot blow it down.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Talk about how you think the pigs felt when the wolf blew the houses down.

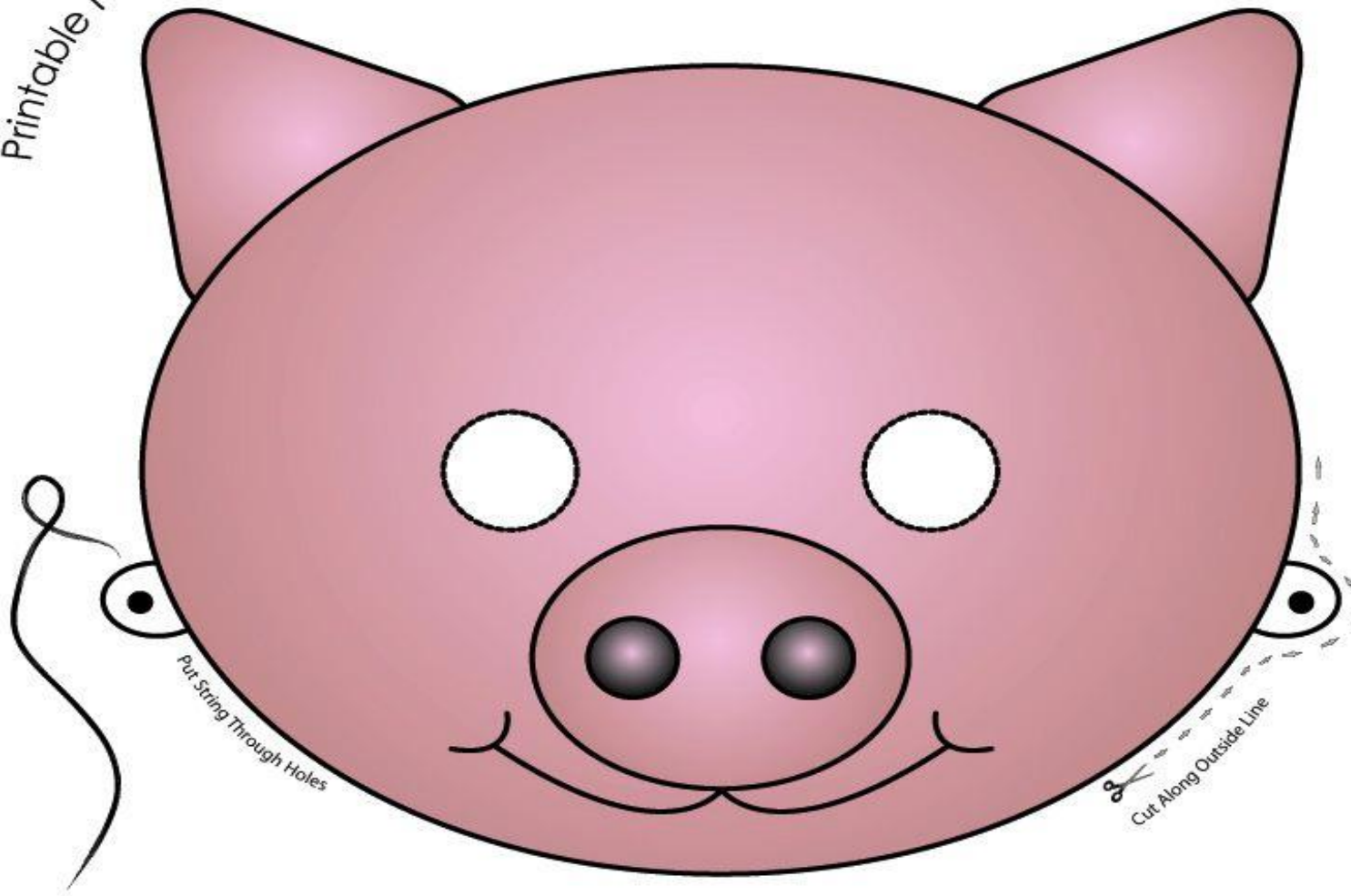

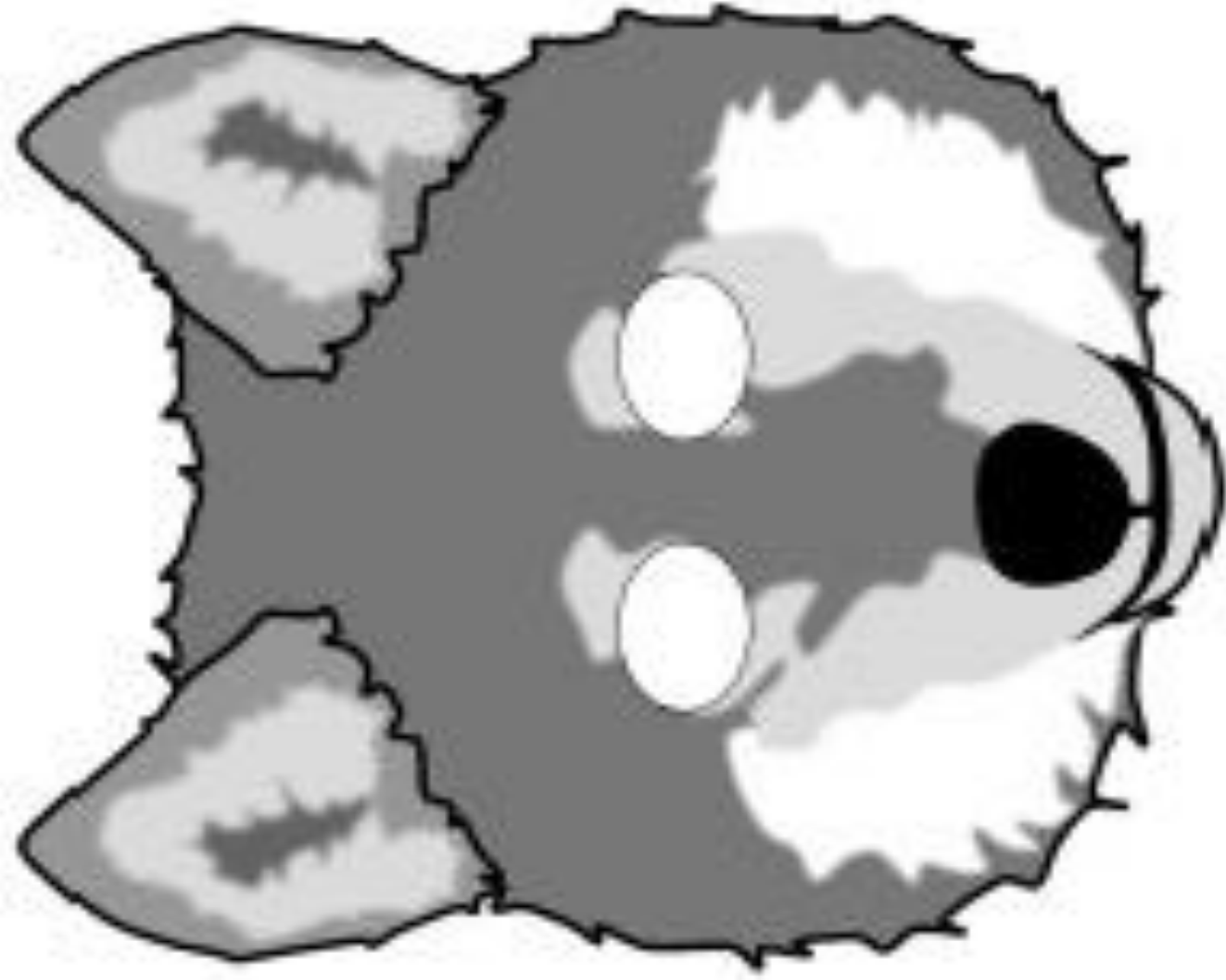
Printable Pig Mask
