Introduce Jack and the beanstalk, read the story asking children questions about the book. Children to join in with repeated refrains.

On you tube there is the Oxbridge baby version of the story.



Phonics

Feely Box Sing to tune of “Old Macdonald has a farm” Child 1 chooses an object inside feely box and makes its sound. Others guess what it is and sing as a verse of rhyme eg (bell) ‘with a tinkle, tinkle here and a. there, Ali Ali has a box e-i-e-i-o’.s

Week 5

Jack and the beanstalk.



If you can print the finger puppets or numbers below off or use them as template for other activities.

Expressive Arts and Design

Imagine a beanstalk grew in your garden! Draw a picture of what it would look like and what would be at the top of the beanstalk?



Mathematics

The beanstalk was very tall! Can you find 3 things that are taller than you and 3 things that are shorter than you?

Or lay down and place objects/bricks down the side of someone and see how many object tall they are?



Communication and Language.

Set up a castle role-play area. Encourage the children to act out the story of Jack and the Beanstalk with their friends using the repeated refrains from the story.



Physical Development

Fill a large activity tray with real leaves of different sizes. Provide children with some scissors and encourage them to cut up the leaves into different shapes to develop their scissor skills.



Provide plant pots, tweezers and beans. Encourage the children pick up the beans with the tweezers and fill the plant pots.





Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Look at pages from different parts of the story. Ask the children to identify how Jack might be feeling in those parts of the story. Why do they think that?
- Explain to the children that the giant really is friendly, he just doesn't know how to make friends. What advice can they give the giant about being a good friend?

Understanding the world.

The bean grew into a beanstalk when it was planted in Jack's garden. Ask a grown up if you can plant some seeds in your garden or a plant pot. Think about how we take care of plants and what the seed will help to make it grow. Either take a picture or draw a picture of what it looks like at different stages of growth.
