

English

- To be able to write their own version of a myth or legend inspired by the story of Beowulf.
- To write their own version of a fantasy narrative, linked to a fabulous picture book – ‘The Lost Thing’ by Shaun Tan.
- In Guided Reading, we are reading ‘Letters from the Lighthouse’ by Emma Carroll.
- At the end of each day, the class story is ‘Anglo-Saxon Boy’ by Tony Bradman.

Science

In Science, our theme is Material World:

- To learn about different materials and how they change.
- To experiment with thermal and electrical conductors and insulators.
- To experiment with filtering and separating materials.
- To conduct fair tests and accurately record results.

Mathematics

- Number: To understand the place value of and perform calculations with numbers up to 1,000,000, including comparing, ordering and rounding.
- Number: To use mental calculation and formal written methods for addition and subtraction.
- Measurement: To determine the perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes.

- Learning about electrical systems and how they work.
- To use that knowledge to create electronic greetings cards.
